

Report on BMF- Kenya work for March 2025

INTRODUCTION

POLICE AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH

The highlight of our activities in the month of March was a unique outreach to the community in Kikuyu sub-county, held by BMF in conjunction with the Police in Kikuyu.

The event was held in the PCEA Hall, Ondiri, on 30th of March.

Present were 20 Police Officers, led by the Deputy Officer commanding the station.

The meeting was held from 11am to 1pm.

About 200 men and some women were in attendance, coming from the entire Kikuyu sub-county.

Three officers shared their stories and the whole team sang three hymns.


I was the main speaker.

Over 76 people present responded to the prayer for salvation.

After the meeting, we enjoyed a cup of tea and cakes.

Community members had a wonderful opportunity to interact with the Police.

There is a plan to conduct these kinds of joint outreaches in three other areas in Kikuyu sub-county.



ONDIRI CENTRAL OUTREACH

A combined Ondiri Association Chapter's outreach was conducted on Saturday 8th March from 11am to 1pm at Kikuyu Town Market Hall.

The meeting was attended by over 200 men. Notable among the attendees was one of the men who have been opposing the work in the area.

He called me in the evening and apologised for what he has been doing and said that he believed in the work we are doing. It was such a great blessing to see the Lord's work in the hearts of men.

Over 100 men responded to the call of salvation.

PRAYER

As the work has continued to reach to the communities and the Government Offices, there has been a continuous effort by the political class to infiltrate the work.

We have seen this trend before, around 2010 to 2012, when we had to stop some outreach programmes to disengage with the infiltration.

We sense that we will need to re-evaluate some engagement with the political leaders in Government. Consequently, we have decided not to attend their meetings, to report on what we are doing.

Pray with us that the Lord will give us wisdom and understanding in our engagement with the Government.

1. MURICHO YOUTH OUTREACH.

Attendance: 35 teenage boys, aged 13 to 18 years.

Speakers: Stephen Ngugi and Samuel Njogu.

Salvation: All 35 boys responded to the prayer of salvation.

Remarks: The boys attending were on mid-term holiday from school.

They joined the Muricho Chapter and committed to assist in reaching out to more teenagers in the community.

2. KIAMBU MEN OUTREACH

Time: 2pm to 6pm.

Venue: Sasini Retreat Grounds.

Attendance: 160 men, aged 18 to 35.

Speakers: Daniel Kamau and Samuel Njogu and two local speakers.

Salvation: about 80 men responded to the prayer of salvation.

Remarks: Outreach was done in conjunction with local churches within Kiambu town. The men engaged in various spots with three coaches officiating, volleyball, football and physical fitness activities.

5. DISCIPLESHIP CLASSES

Regular outreach discipleship classes have continued every Friday and Sunday in Ondiri area to take the new believers through the new life discipleship classes

Several strategic and prayer meetings were held to plan and readjust up-coming meetings in April and beyond. I met Chapter Chairmen and officials in different Chapters within the month.

there at 2pm when the inmates were inside their cells after finishing lunch. The Wardens on duty allowed us in, and we went directly to the O.Cs office and signed the Visitors book. The O.C asked the Wardens to assemble all the men enrolled in that unit outside in the fenced compound. 683 men assembled. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 597 men received salvation 18 of whom were Muslims, and one had fasted because it was the month of Ramadan for Muslims to fast. After listening clearly to our message, the Muslim man decided to cancel the fasting even though he had already fasted 29 days, asking for forgiveness from Allah for the sins which caused him to be put in jail. He realised that after accepting Jesus as his Saviour those sins are washed away, so he rejoiced and became a new creature. We prayed for all those who received salvation to stand firm in Christ and donated five boxes of washing soap to that prison at the end.

On 30th March, Jude Musisi and I went to Kakiika Prison. We arrived at 10:00am local time when the Muslim inmates were out in the compound praying their Eid prayers led by the Imam from the nearby Mosque. Muslims from that mosque supported the Muslim inmates to fast during the month of Ramadan by buying good food for them to eat in the morning and evening. Even on Eid day they had bought meat and other foodstuffs for the inmates. We waited for an hour and then the O.C asked the none-Muslims to join the group to listen to our message because we wanted to speak to all of them. Jude gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 234 men received salvation out of the 287 men who were present. Jude opened the Bible afterwards and started ministering to them. He explained how Jesus paid for sins in full, and we don't need to celebrate Eid and other religious rituals, but just need to look unto Him for righteousness and eternity. Many men perceived that message well and 2 Muslim men come out to confess their sins at the end. We donated five boxes of washing soap and two Bibles to that prison at the end.

On 30th March, Kasamba Jacob and Tumukunde Jimmy went to Kibito Prison to start discipleship meetings for the men who had received salvation on our visit to that prison in February this year. They ministered to 85 men on the theme of why God created man in Gen: 1: 26- 28, the fall of man in Gen:3, and restoration of man to the image and likeness of God through Jesus' death.

On 31st March, Jude Musisi and I went to Isingiro Prison. We arrived there at 8am when the inmates were still in the morning assembly. The O.C welcomed us and invited Jude to carry on, He gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 314 men received

salvation out of the 366 men who were in the assembly. Jude wanted to minister to them after but the rain started and we just prayed a short for those who received salvation and donated five boxes of washing soap and one Bible to that prison.

No. Of men reached since 2008 = 111,354.

No. Of men received salvation since 20008. = 86,440.
